From the Desk of Pastor Richard

This month in worship, we're focusing on the book of Psalms. This unique book consists of one-hundred-fifty individual psalms, which each center on things people said to God. What's interesting is that from all of these psalms, four patterns of speaking to God emerge.

The first pattern of speaking to God is to praise God by saying something like, "You're great." An example of this can be found in Psalm 8, which begins this way:

NIV Psalm 8:1 LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!

Praise psalms such as this one acknowledge God's power and faithfulness and present them as truths about God's identity. As a result, they were regularly used in worship.

The second pattern of speaking to God is to cry out to God and say, "Help!" Psalm 3 is a perfect example of such a cry for help:

NIV Psalm 3:1 LORD, how many are my foes! How many rise up against me!

Sometimes psalms like this were used in a community during a national crisis. At other times, an individual might rely on them when going through a time of personal crisis. Imagine the comfort these words would bring to individuals and their families when going through a difficult time!

The third pattern of speaking to God is to say, "I trust you." One of the most well-known examples of this is Psalm 23:

NIV Psalm 23:1 The LORD is my shepherd, I lack nothing.

People often used psalms like this to express confidence that God would protect them, especially when they felt surrounded by their enemies.

The fourth pattern of speaking to God is to respond and say, "Thank you." We see an example of this in Psalm 30:

NIV Psalm 30:1 I will exalt you, LORD, for you lifted me out of the depths and did not let my enemies gloat over me.

A characteristic of "thank you" psalms is that they tell the story of what God has done on behalf of the people.

These different patterns of speaking to God are a reminder that we, too, are invited to praise God, to cry out when in distress, to express confidence that God is with us, and to say "thank you" to God for blessing us in so many ways, most specifically, through Jesus.

A Message from Pastor Will Called to Be - God's People

In Mark 3:13-30, Jesus "appointed twelve so that they might be with him and might send them out to preach." He called them apostles (messengers) to preach and "have authority." It's interesting because this number 12 occurs throughout the Old and New Testament and in fact, the Apostles themselves would have recognized how significant this "calling of the twelve" was! Jesus was calling them with the same purpose God called the twelve tribes of Israel in Exodus. Jesus was calling the apostles to be His people in the Kingdom of God.

The twelve tribes of Israel were God's special set apart people through whom salvation and restoration would come to the world. And this plan of salvation reached its winning moment in Jesus' death and resurrection. God's kingdom had begun on earth! But this call to be God's set apart people didn't end with those twelve apostles. No! Those apostles carried God's Word to others. More and more people received what God had done through Jesus Christ. People began to see the freedom they had in being God's people through Jesus, too!

These new people - God's New Kingdom people - are the church. As we consider what it means to be the church today, we cannot ignore the call to be God's People here and now. As God's people, much like the tribes of Israel, we are given the Kingdom task of carrying out that Good News to others. As salvation came through Israel, salvation through Jesus is now proclaimed to others through us.

Even more so, as God's people, we share in the inheritance promised to Abraham, Jacob, and his descendants! We received the promise that God is coming to restore creation that we might be with Him as He dwells with us. In other words, we get to "be with Him. (v. 14)"

If we are God's people, what are the ways we can be God's people - be His church - to our neighbors and our family? In many ways, the answer becomes "purpose." Our everyday lives become one filled with the purpose of glorifying God and sharing His gifts whatever we may do, and wherever we may be. In other words, we don't drop everything to pursue a "churchier" existence. Instead, our everyday lives become ones in which we are always sharing what Christ has done for us through our words and actions, that others might become God's people, too.
