They asked me why I do this, and I shared that sometimes one version does a better job of catching the sense and meaning of a verse than another. I was next asked if there is a version of the Bible that I prefer. Now, if you ever consider asking me this question, be forewarned; I love discussing the various English versions of the Bible and can spend hours pointing out the differences between them.

Anyone who has shopped for a Bible recently knows that the sheer number of versions can be confusing. The last time I was in one of our local Christian bookstores, I noticed that their Bible section included the following:

- The King James Version (KJV)
- The New King James Version (NKJV)
- The New International Version (NIV)
- The New International Readers Version (NIRV)
- The New Revised Standard Version (NRSV)
- The English Standard Version (ESV)
- The New Catholic Bible (NCB)
- The New American Standard Version (NAS)
- The Message Bible
- The New Living Translation (NLT)
- The New Jerusalem Bible (NJB)
- The New Century Version (NCV)
- The Contemporary English Version (CEV)
- The Good News Translation (GNT)

What is amazing is that there are many more versions besides those listed above. My standard answer as to which is best is that there is no "best Bible." I then typically encourage individuals to have more than one Bible and compare them to each other. But as I consider my standard answer, I realize that there is a "best version of the Bible" for you. In this case, the best version is the one that is written in such a way that it feels comfortable and that most clearly reveals Jesus to you.

May the Lord bless you as you discover how God's Word speaks to you! In Jesus.

A Message from Pastor Will Called to Be : God's New Creation

2 Corinthians 5:16-18 There is something magical about a new pair of shoes. I remember going into the JC Penny or Payless as a kid and the ritual of getting a new pair of shoes. I would find my new size. Then there was the trying on, my mom having me stand up as she pressed a thumb on the toe box, making sure there was enough room. Then, if I was lucky, she threw my old shoes in the box while I wore my cool, new shoes out the store. I felt like a new man; a rock star in my new shoes. I was a different person than who had walked in.

Paul, in his 2nd letter to the Corinthians, says of those who belong to Christ, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come." Though we may not feel like it - though we may have some of the same old habits and our bodies still seem to get older - we are made brand new in Jesus. Why? Because God says so. Because we belong to Jesus. We are a new creation.

In Christ's death our sins are no longer counted against us, and in his resurrection, Jesus gives us His life to share in - a life that never ends. And so, knowing this, we are called to live as this new creation. We are called to walk in those new shoes, confident in the gift we have received from our good God. We throw our old shoes - our old habits and ways of seeing the world - into the box while we walk in a new path. We have been called to be in a relationship with God, our Father, and offer reconciliation to others through worship, prayer, connecting with our neighbors, and caring for others as Christ has cared for us.
