From the Desk of Pastor Richard

One of the unique portions of the book of Exodus is The Song of Miriam and Moses, which is in chapter 15. While this is referred to as a song it is actually a poem. One thing to note about Hebrew poetry is that it is unlike modern western poetry in its sound or structure. Interestingly, this is the only portion of the book of Exodus that was written in poetry. Somehow, the use of a poem seems appropriate at this crucial moment in the Exodus since it makes God's message easier to remember and share. And remembering and sharing the words of Moses and his sister Miriam is just what people did for generations afterward whenever they commemorated the events of the Exodus.

At its heart, The Song of Miriam and Moses is meant to praise God as Lord and Savior. Notice how verse 13 uses the word 'redeemed' to describe God's role:

*In your unfailing love you will lead
the people you have redeemed.
In your strength you will guide them
to your holy dwelling. (Exodus 15:13 - NIV)*

The meaning of this passage is clear: God had purchased the Israelites' freedom and guided them to safety. Verse 16 makes the same point but instead uses the word 'bought' to describe God's actions:

*By the power of your arm
they will be as still as a stone—
until your people pass by, Lord,
until the people you bought pass by. (Exodus 15:16 - NIV)*

God's role as Lord and Savior in the Exodus points us to God's greater rescue mission through the cross. It is at the cross that Jesus purchases and redeems us and ultimately sets us free.

They work with people based on their need, regardless of race, religion or nationality, and they do not evangelize. They provide aid in emergencies and help families restore their lives.

LWR partners with communities to build and grow rural economies. They strive to break the cycle of poverty, so families and communities can thrive. Their goal is to help people build self-sufficiency and create new community- owned approaches to problem solving that will last long after their projects end.

The World of Good Emergency Response Fund was established to ensure sufficient funds are readily available to be put to immediate use on the front lines in the event of a natural disaster or humanitarian crisis. This allows LWR to quickly provide emergency food, water, shelter and more.
